Club Captain's Report

Season Opener

Wow, what a start to the season, we were blessed with great weather and congratulations to everyone who made the Open Day a great success.

Throughout this season we will be able to meet our life saving commitments due to the volunteering efforts of members. This will ensure that visitors to the area are kept safe and know that if they find trouble, we are there to help.

Training and Patrols

Big shout out to Ciaran McDonald and Jenna Stacey who have done a fantastic effort organising the patrol roster and training and skills maintenance for this season

We are currently delivering training to 38 members who are either transitioning from their SRC qualification to the Bronze qualification or are undertaking the SRC and Bronze qualification for the first time. These newly qualified members will provide each patrol with additional members. It is hoped that by the end of this season each patrol will become self sufficient and patrol swaps will become a thing of the past. More information on how this will work will be provided later in the season.

As we move forward, this season will see a stronger approach to more structured training utilising our members who are completing their training qualifications, which will help meet members needs and ensure that the load is shared between trainers.

House Keeping

We are all volunteers, and we need to respect the time that we give to the club and life saving in general. However, myself and our Patrol Officer Ciaran McDonald are having to chase people to help provide life saving services to events outside of the time tabled patrols. If we send a request out seeking members to fulfil these duties, please reply if you are available or not. These requests are done utilising the clubs email system and social media so all members receive these requests. Please ensure that the workload is shared amongst the membership and details about requirements to provide water safety for the triathlon series and Christmas day patrol can be found elsewhere in this newsletter.



Clifton Carnival

The club will host both a Junior and Open carnival, on the 11th / 12th of February. To host these events is a big undertaking, however through teamwork and support we will once again provide the stage for the best carnival weekend in the state.

Clubhouse Improvements

Our new 12x8m Surf Boat Shed is nearing completion and we have had quite a few delays but please bear with us as we are striving to get this building erected by Christmas.

Our 14-kWh solar system has, over the last few months has generated over \$1000 in savings for the club which means that we will have more money to spend on equipment and training but importantly helps us reduce our environmental footprint.

The build of the new kitchen and upstairs toilets has been caught up in the skills shortage crisis and materials shortage however we will push through with this project to get it completed in the new year.

SLST requires for every 10 kids competing that our club provides 1 Official. If we don't have enough officials not all kids can compete and this has occurred at other clubs. Nippers... How we would like to roll each Sunday

Arrive on time if not EARLY... We will start at 10am promptly. The bell will ring with 5mins to go so all nippers are sitting behind their age group tubs ready to start.

Your nipper needs to have on:

- Wetsuit
- Pink Vest
- Club Cap
- Sunscreen

Sign your child in on the clipboard. This can be passed around when session has started. Ask your child's age group coordinator do they need a hand today... Let them know you are keen to help out! (Have your wetsuit on ready to get wet☺)

SIGN THEM OUT AT END OF SESSION Back into your care!

Showers/Change Rooms: NO WETSUITS IN THE SHOWERS AT ALL!

Parents please help enforce this with your children.

Remove wetsuits before getting in and then keep your Shower Time Short!!!! This is a big deal we have many nippers who would like to rinse off so please be respectful.

Encourage kids to help carry boards back to the club. They are great at getting them to the beach not so great returning them.

Assist in storing them too please. The same people cant be washing off boards and storing them each Sunday. Many hands make light work... ☑

Senior Sports Update

Senior training is well underway with our first carnival of the season held at Bridport on Sunday, 11 December 2022, very successful.

We recently celebrated the opening of the surf sports season with a team dinner and meeting on Thursday, 1 December 2022. It was a great opportunity to welcome a new tribe of budding young U14 athletes into our team!

Below are a few things we discussed at our meeting which we thought of importance to share for anyone who might have missed it!!

Gear Policy -

It was identified by the Senior Surf Sports Committee that it would be timely to update the senior equipment policy for the forthcoming season. This gear policy has been accepted by the Club Committee and in consultation with Craft Captain Graeme Van Galen.

Surf Craft Policy 2022-23 -

Craft Allocation to members will be approved on an annual basis, it is expected that Club gear (boards, ski, and paddles) will be given priority to members who are in a development stage of the sport.

Once the member has gained a good ability on the craft (2 seasons maximum or turns 17), it is expected that the craft will be passed on to the next group coming through and that member will obtain their own private craft.

All club gear taken home **MUST BE** stored indoors, or on a rack and undercover. If your board or ski is laying on the lawn out the back, you will not be approved of having the craft as long-term sunlight will damage it. This mainly applies to members who take skis and paddles home over the winter and train elsewhere.



If you are unable to attend training sessions on a constant level the craft will have to be stored at the club or given to another member to use. It is unfair to stop another member using the craft if you are not using the gear.

All craft / paddles will be washed down after every use in fresh water.

Any damage to club gear from poor storage, poor transportation will be charged to member for repairs.

Club rack allocation- the priority will be for Club gear, then members who train regularly with the squad.

The club cannot provide craft for every member, club gear is to be used for members deciding if they like the sport and it is expected that they purchase their own gear after 1 or 2 seasons. Below are some websites that are a good source of gear that can be bought privately. Transport of these items from the mainland can be done through "Next Level Kayaking"

If there is not enough craft i.e., skis / paddles to be used at a carnival the Clifton Coach will determine the allocation and this will be based on competency, the training that member has done over the season.

Club Skis -

Are to be shared between all members who are 15 years of age as 30 September, proficient BM holders/ met prerequisites for BM. Training on club surf skis: 13 years of age as of 30 September, proficient SRC holder or met prerequisites for BM, non-high intensity training (only for purpose of technique / skill development) and supervised/ instructed by qualified coach.

Club skis will be allocated by the Clifton coach for training and competition base upon:

- The club cannot provide craft for every member, club gear is to be used for members deciding if they like the sport and it is expected that they purchase their own gear after 1 or 2 seasons.
- If there is not enough craft i.e. skis / paddles to be used at a carnival the Clifton Coach will determine the allocation and this will be based on competency, the training that member has done over the season.
- At training Clifton Coach will allocate gear to the best of their ability to ensure maximal numbers on the water, that the allocation of gear is fair and equitable and safety is the highest priority.
- No one owns a club ski or paddle, and they are to be shared between members.
- Any issues regarding this, please talk to Matt or Courtney



Development Ski -

Current under 15 competitors & people new to ski paddling. Priority given to those athletes considering competition. Please chat to Matt or Courtney about eligibility.

The next session will be on Sunday, 18 January 2022 at 8am with Grinner. These sessions will be run at Clifton and be spread over the course of several weeks. Please come prepared for some land-based work first on the ski ergos prior to potentially heading into the water.

Trailer Towing to Carnivals -

Due to rising costs of fuel prices, reoccurring drivers, we have decided to implement a charge for gear being towed to carnivals (outside of southern Tasmania).

The price for gear will be as follows:

- Pay upfront: \$50 per person (S&B)
- \$30 (B only), \$100 for 2-3 competitors from one family. This covers all 3 x northern carnivals for the season.
- Per Carnival: Ski: \$15, Board: \$10 and ski and Board \$20.

This is to be transferred to the designated senior surf sports committee bank account. Details to be emailed.

Sydney Trip -

The preparations for the club Sydney trip to compete in the Manly and Freshwater Carnivals are progressing nicely. We will be advising in relation to the gear and trailer at a later date.

The SLST Board has determined that all volunteers holding a child/youth facing position are required to complete SLSA's online Child Safe Awareness course before 31 December 2022.

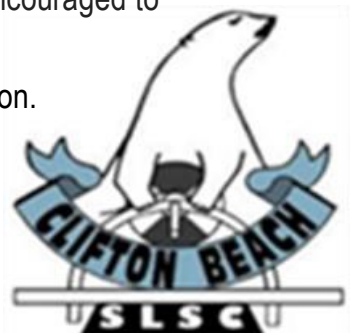
This includes positions such as:

- Officers on surf life saving club or volunteer marine rescue unit committees
- Patrol Captains and Vice Patrol Captains
- Junior Activity Chairs and Age Managers
- Surf Sport Coaches and Officials
- Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators
- MPIOs and Complaints Managers
- Committee members (that have YAWG representatives on them)
- Water Safety
- Event Management (eg Lifesaving Development Camp Leaders)
- Canteen volunteers
- First Aid personnel

I assure you it will be well worth your effort and time to understand the process of learning about these available resources for our members in SLSA members area. We encourage all parents, care givers and volunteers to take 15 minutes to complete this course. It will provide some understanding of the steps SLST is taking to ensure the wellbeing of children and youths. The more members participating shows the caring community we are in. Even if you aren't helping out in official roles at the moment, you are highly encouraged to learn about how we keep trying to learn of many ways to look out for each other.

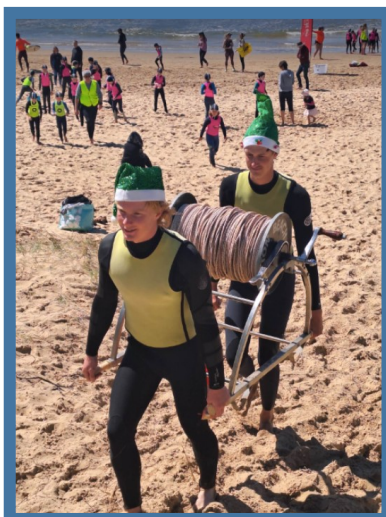
